IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

Please note that changes were made to the NCC Constitution at the Annual Conference 2018 which requires that the **new deadline for executive nominations is 30 days before the Conference, that is Thursday October 2nd.** However, we encourage members to get their nominations as soon as possible before this date.

Persons nominating for election to the Executive must be a member of a Member Body of the NCC and their nomination endorsed by an Office Holder of that member body,

The number of persons elected to the Executive shall be twelve (12). All endorsed members of member groups are eligible to stand for election.

If an election is required, nominated candidates may also speak to the Conference for up to three minutes prior to the election, in support of their candidacy. This is likely to occur on Sunday 29th October. Please refer to the NCC Constitution and the 'Annual Conference Rules for Voting on Motions and for the Election of the Executive' found at www.nature.org.au for more detailed information.

The Executive usually meets on the **3rd Monday** of each month, except January, from approximately 5.30pm to 8pm. Members are expected to attend regularly. Teleconference facilities are available for regional members not able to attend meetings in Sydney.
